Celebrate the 62nd birthday of the Mustang with a co-cruise with Pierce County Mustang Club! We'll meet up with the other PCMC at I-5 and Highway 512 Park & Ride (by McDonalds) at 9am. Leave at 9:30am.

Scenic Drive to Alder Lake Dam, near Mt. Rainier and Enumclaw. The dam forms 7-mile-long Alder Lake, which has 28 miles of shoreline and covers more than 3,000 acres at maximum elevation. The area includes Alder Lake Park, Rocky Point Campground and Sunny Beach Point (not open until 5/16), all of which are popular spots for boating, swimming, water skiing, fishing, camping and other outdoor recreation.

From Highway 512, drive S. Hwy 7 (60 minutes) or S. 161 (1 hour, 15 minutes). Exact route is TBD. Alder Lake Park Day Use Parking Pass is \$10. Brush up on your Mustang trivia -- there will be a test!

Lunch afterwards (Pacific Cascade members) at the Mount Rainier Railroad Dining Company at 54106 Mountain Highway East, Elbe, WA 98330 just past the southeast end of the lake. They serve American food with burgers starting at \$16.

 - Choose session 1, 2, or both
 - Pay for your registration (\$35 per session)
 - Get ready for FUN!
- The Autocross is organized as a "FUN RUN". It will be non-competitive with no records kept. You'll see your lap time displayed at the end of every run for 10 seconds. A perfect event for new and experienced Autocrossers.

- There are 2 sessions for up to 30 cars each session -- a morning session from 8:30am – Noon, and an afternoon session from 12:30 - 4pm. You can sign up for one or BOTH sessions if you like!
- Drivers in each session should be able to get 4-6 runs in
- Cost will be only \$35 for each session to encourage participation
- There will be a driver's meeting, track walk, and parade lap each session to help familiarize you with the course
- IF we have space available after PCMC members register, we will invite surrounding Mustang clubs to join us., probably in mid-April.

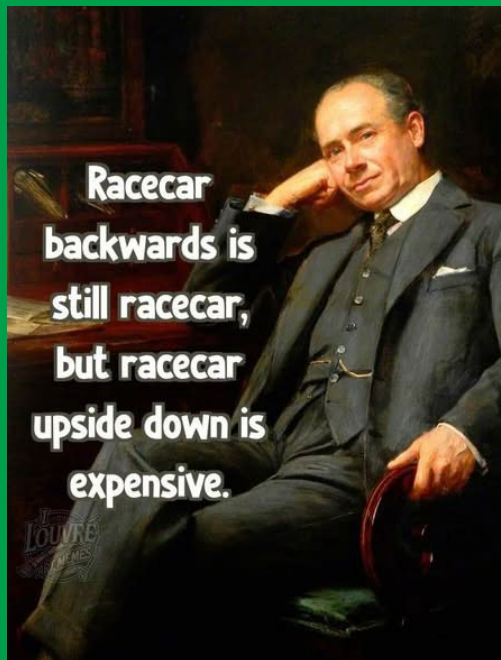

LeMay America's Car Museum Specialty License Plate Now Available

LeMay — America's Car Museum has officially unveiled its long-awaited specialty license plate, which is now available through the Washington State Department of Licensing.

The new plate directly supports the museum's mission as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, with proceeds going toward the preservation and sharing of America's automotive history, expanding educational programming, and continuing the celebration of car culture for future generations, a release said.

The ACM plate is one of the only license plates in the country dedicated to a car museum. After completing the state's approval process, the museum touted a design reflecting its visual identity and commitment to honoring the past while driving into the future, the release said.

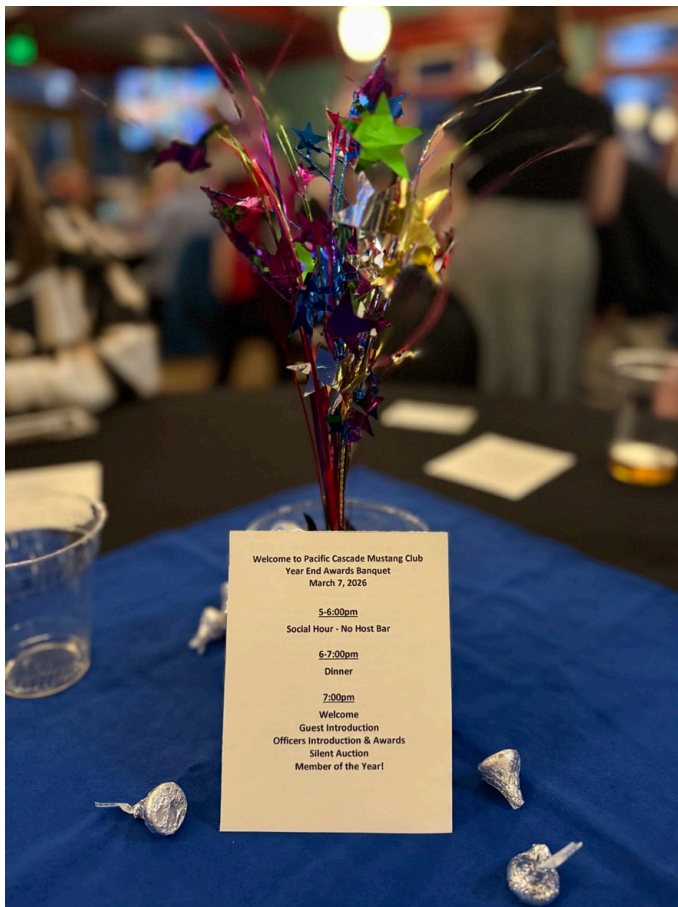
PCMC Annual Banquet Recap

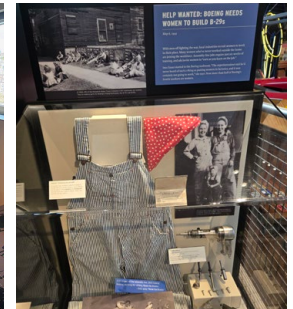
The trip to the Museum of History & Industry in Seattle was a success. Eight club members attended, starting with five of us meeting in Renton and driving in without issue via I-5.

Caravan Safety

With the weather improving and our club drives becoming more frequent, please review these guidelines to ensure the safety of our group and the public.

You are living the dream on the open road, the envy of all you pass (or who pass you, depending on the speed of your steed). Rather than being a lone wolf, you are taking advantage of safety in numbers and caravanning with other like-minded enthusiasts.

Safety and Coordination

- **Prioritize Traffic Flow:** Avoid impeding other motorists. Lead cars should ensure there is ample space for the entire caravan before changing lanes.
- **Coordinated Lane Changes:** The caboose may move early to secure a gap. As a lead car, I will flash my directional signal briefly to indicate intent before officially signaling.
- **Maintain Elasticity:** On two-lane highways, it may be impossible for the entire group to pass at once. Please remain patient and only follow the lead car when it is safe.
- **Individual Responsibility:** Monitor all traffic lights, pedestrians, and cyclists. Do not assume an intersection is clear just because the car ahead of you passed through.
- **Passing:** Pass other traffic quickly and stay in the right lane until there is sufficient room to re-enter the formation.
- **Documentation:** Always carry your license, registration, and insurance.

Key Elements of a Club Drive

- **Organizer:** The organizer will hold a meeting before the start to discuss the route, hazards and share directions or a map.
- **Groups:** We may split into multiple groups, each with a Group Leader and a Caboose.
- **The Caboose:** The caboose must know the route to assist stragglers and will notify the leader if the group becomes separated.
- **Visual Contact:** If the leader and caboose move toward the center line, the rest of the group should move toward the center line so the leader can verify the car count.

On the Drive

- **Positioning:** Line up where you are comfortable: faster drivers toward the front and slower paces toward the rear.
- **Communication:** Pay attention to the cars immediately in front and behind you to relay signals.
- **Traffic Lights:** Do not run red lights to stay with the group; we will wait for you at a safe pull-out.
- **Maneuvers:** Use “breadcrumbing” to signal turns to lagging cars and “caterpillaring” when pulling off or onto the shoulder.
- **Spacing:** Maintain 3 to 5 car lengths to avoid a “slinky” effect.

Preparation and Tips

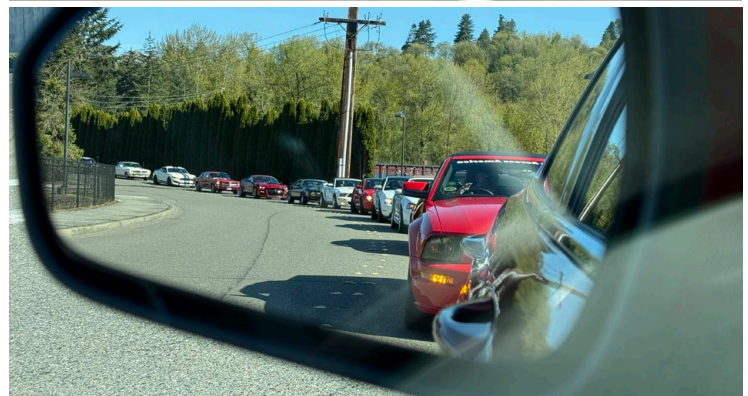
1. **Vehicle Readiness:** Ensure your Mustang is in top condition (tires, brakes, fluids). If you suspect mechanical issues, please sit the drive out.

2. **Alertness:** Get a good night’s sleep and eat breakfast before the drive.
3. **Fuel:** Fill your tank as close to the meeting spot as possible so the group remains on the same refueling schedule.
4. **Contact Info:** Add the leader’s cell number to your phone and keep your member directory handy. Note that cell reception may be spotty.
5. **Safety Signals:** Keep headlights on. If you need the group to stop and have no service, flash your lights or put your arm out the window with a clenched fist.
6. **Separation:** If you get lost, continue to the next scheduled pit stop.
7. **Leaving the Group:** If you decide to “do your own thing,” please notify a leader so we do not spend time searching for you.

By practicing discipline and teamwork, we can ensure everyone reaches our destination safely and comes home safely too.

47th International Mustang Meet September 3rd - 7th, 2026 in Richmond BC Hosted by the Greater Vancouver Mustang Association

If you've ever considered attending the annual International Mustang Meet, IMM 47 will be right in our own backyard in Richmond BC (near Vancouver) next Labor Day Weekend Sept. 3-7, 2026). Several PCMC Members have attended IMM's in the past, to rave reviews. We have several club members who already have their cars registered and hotel booked for IMM 47. Details on a club caravan will be announced closer to the date next September.

A Little History about the International Mustang Meet (thank you to Linda Hallberg) - The International Mustang Meet began in 1980 when two Mustangers, one American and one Canadian, met at a World of Wheels car show while each was showing a Mustang Convertible. They became best friends and thought it would be a great idea that an International Mustang Meet be held each year. They would start in Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada and then swap between the US and Canada each year. During that first year, there were three clubs and 75 cars, and the Labor Day weekend was chosen to allow for travel to the meet each year.

Today, the event has become more than a car show. There are 300-500 vehicles each year that gather on Labor Day weekend, and is a social event reuniting friendships made through the years. Friday night begins with a Welcome Party; Saturday is the show day followed by a BBQ in the evening. On Sunday there could be a special drive, potential Auto Cross or Poker Run, and ends with an Awards Banquet. Finally, we gather for breakfast on Monday morning and say goodbye until next year.
