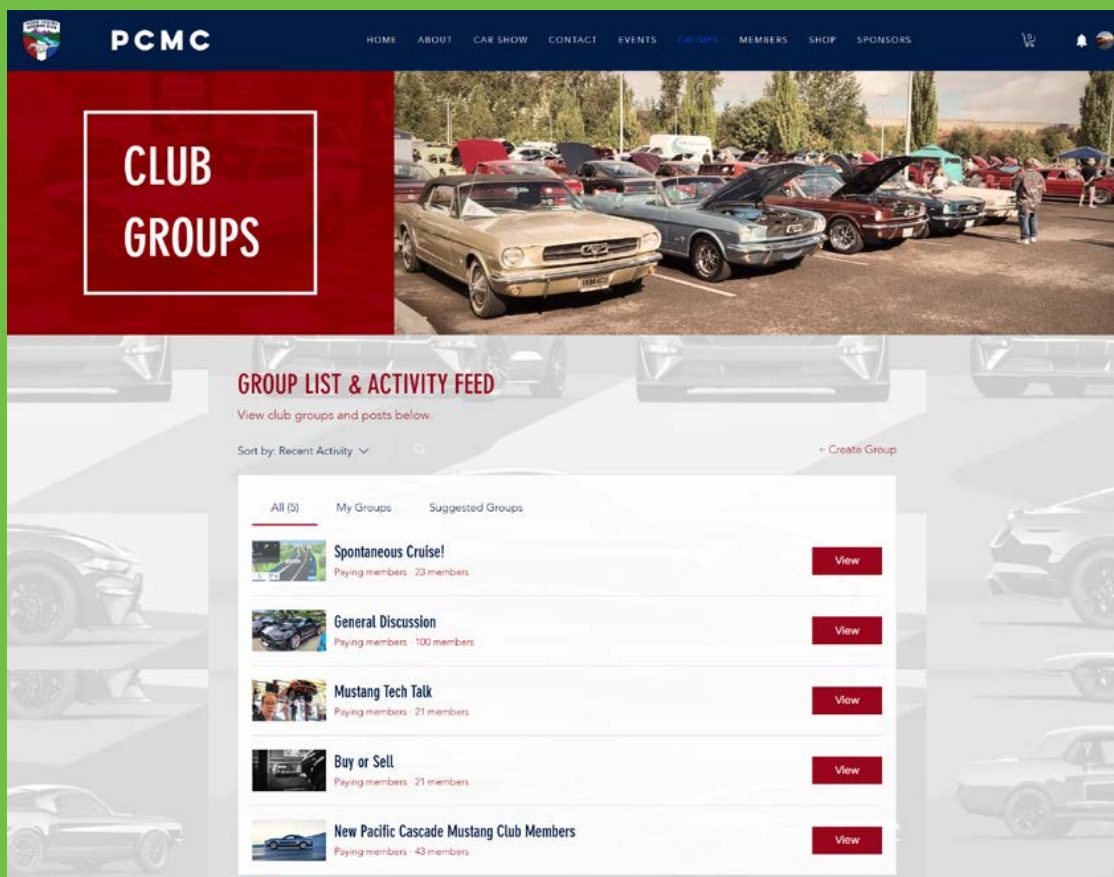

6 Habits That Could Be Hurting Your Car

Our lovely vintage cars are machines that have stood the test of time, made up of aging parts and pieces that we've treated with extra care. None of us actively want to hurt our rides, yet more than a few of us have bad habits that can be silently hurting or shortening the life of our cars.

Whether intentional or not, it's the little things that can often chip away and degrade our vehicles. One small thing wears out, then suddenly the "while I'm in there" bug strikes and a project car is born. It doesn't have to be that way, or at least you can prevent a lot of common and annoying problems with some basic maintenance and good habits. Here are six items to keep in mind as you enjoy your drive.



Not properly inflating tires

Tires are the only thing that actually contacts the road, so why is it so common for people to neglect them? Proper inflation should be the bare minimum, as it not only helps the handling of the car but also extends the life of the tires. Rolling around on underinflated rubber builds heat in the tire, which can lead to a failure like a blowout. Keep your tires happy and your passengers safe by checking and properly inflating your tires at least seasonally, or better yet, even more regularly.

Low or overfilled fluids

Just like the air pressure in your tires, the oil, coolant, brakes, and various other systems are designed to work within certain parameters. Not enough or too much can cause problems ranging from leaks to the destruction of very expensive parts. Does your car's engine have the appropriate amount of oil in it? If you're not 100% confident, it should be checked.

For every joke about "sweating horsepower" or "marking its territory," there should come a reminder that cars are not able to create oil. If any is being left on the ground, it is up to you to replace it in order to prevent failure. Coolant, oil, transmission, power steering, and more all deserve regular checks to keep those systems running smoothly.

Lugging the engine

Engines are complicated and designed to meet a multitude of standards and needs. The transmission's job is to keep the engine in its relatively narrow ideal operating range. Drivers can often be ignorant as to where in the RPM range an engine wants to accelerate or cruise and instead choose to drive all engine, transmission, and axle ratio combinations in the same way. This can lead to lugging—putting heavy load on the engine at low RPM—which can cause damaging conditions like knocking. It might feel most efficient or "best" to keep the revs of an engine as low as possible, but in fact that can be quite damaging over time.

Riding the clutch

The clutch exists to disconnect the engine from the transmission. While it is frustrating to drive as if the clutch is an on/off switch, it is best to view it that way. Using the clutch pedal as a footrest, even and especially unintentionally, causes the clutch to partially engage and can lead to slipping or glazing of the friction disc. This is rarely a simple or easy repair as it requires separating the engine from the transmission, which is not often possible with both in the car. When cruising and relaxing, be sure to move that left foot, or you might be using it to walk where you need to go.

Ignoring bad noises

"Just turn up the radio" goes the canned response that most get when asking about a clunk, bang, or scrape noise that comes from their car while driving. It's a tired joke but one that certainly has roots in reality for some. Most cars run fairly smoothly and have a steady cadence of noises while running and driving. Some of these noises sound bad, others are bad, and all noises that simply don't sound normal or only appear under certain conditions should be investigated. Not all will be nightmare scenarios, but checking can save things from getting so much worse.

Not driving at all

Cars are designed to be driven. This is a fact that many old car enthusiasts are forced to deal with, usually after periods of long storage where cars sit still and silently rot away. While letting a car sit can often feel right either for its preservation or because something needs to be repaired for it to run correctly, the longer it sits, the more the fuel turns to sludge inside the fuel tank or carburetor, tires dry rot and flat spot, and seals waste away. The fact is, exercising a car actually keeps it in better condition than having it sit and corrode in place. Unless a static display piece is your goal, keeping a car running and driving regularly is the best thing for it.

Keeping old cars is a never-ending project that we sometimes forget we are working on. Keeping the conscious effort to maintain and best care for our old cars is tough, but not impossible. Especially when we make small changes like these. Have another small thing that can be very costly if ignored? Leave it as a comment. You never know who—or what—you might save.

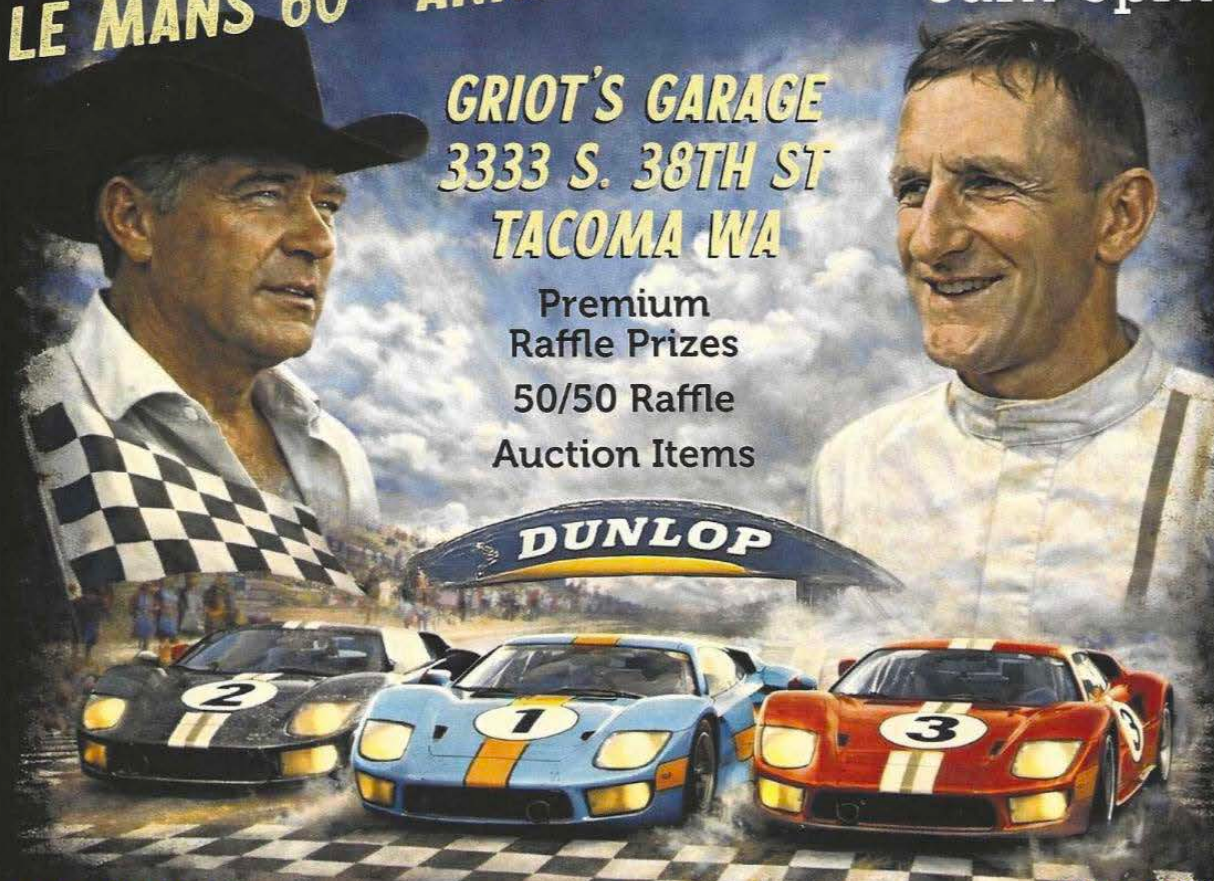

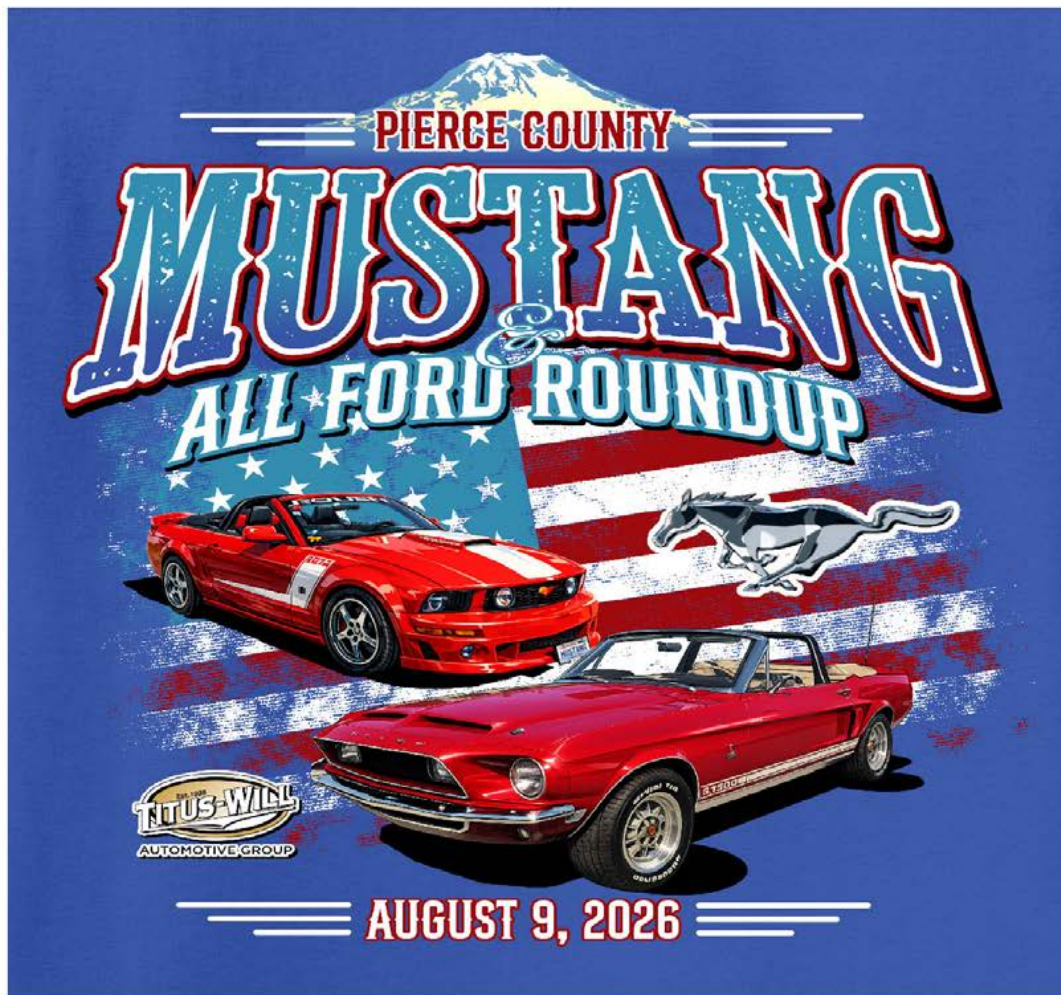

47th International Mustang Meet September 3rd - 7th, 2026 in Richmond BC Hosted by the Greater Vancouver Mustang Association

If you've ever considered attending the annual International Mustang Meet, IMM 47 will be right in our own backyard in Richmond BC (near Vancouver) next Labor Day Weekend Sept. 3-7, 2026). A Little History about the International Mustang Meet (thank you to Linda Hallberg) - The International Mustang Meet began in 1980 when two Mustangers, one American and one Canadian, met at a World of Wheels car show while each was showing a Mustang Convertible. They became best friends and thought it would be a great idea that an International Mustang Meet be held each year. They would start in Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada and then swap between the US and Canada each year. During that first year, there were three clubs and 75 cars, and the Labor Day weekend was chosen to allow for travel to the meet each year.

Today, the event has become more than a car show. There are 300-500 vehicles each year that gather on Labor Day weekend, and is a social event reuniting friendships made through the years. Friday night begins with a Welcome Party; Saturday is the show day followed by a BBQ in the evening. On Sunday there could be a special drive, potential Auto Cross or Poker Run, and ends with an Awards Banquet. Finally, we gather for breakfast on Monday morning and say goodbye until next year.

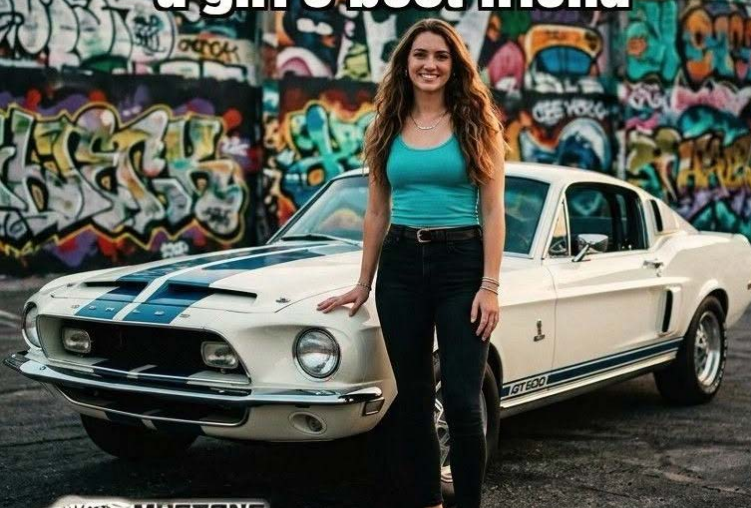
