Proposed Amendments to PCMC Constitution & By-Laws Regarding Membership Applications and Dues

The PCMC Board submits the following proposed amendments to the PCMC Constitution & By-Laws for approval, by vote, to the PCMC membership. The proposed amendments would modify the constitutional and by-law wording in regard to PCMC's Membership offers, durations, and renewal schedules.

The proposed amendment recommends two significant changes:

1. Annual Membership

Annual memberships would start at the time of membership applicant approval, or upon receipt of renewal payment by an existing member. Current member expiration date would be time for the next renewal.

- a. Change: Membership would end on the anniversary of the established date (1,2, or 3 years)
- b. Benefit(s): Easier to track membership status, members get a full year for spend
- c. Potential Cons: Higher activity for membership coordinator on renewals

2. Multi-year Membership Options

PCMC would offer up to 3 years of membership with a cost benefit to the member by selecting a multi-year option. Initial pricing would be set as follows: 1-Year = \$30, 2-Year = \$50, 3-Year = \$70.

- a. Change: Addition of Two- and Three-Year multi-year options
- b. Benefit(s): Higher active club membership, less volume of renewals, longer term membership
- c. Potential Cons: Additional membership types to track, less member income.

The PCMC Board has discussed and supports the changes as the new Wix platform we implemented last year to manage new member applications, track and process membership renewals, and provide centralized communication provides us with a better mechanism in which to solve for the challenges of outstanding renewals, the volume of members that must be contacted at renewal time, and pro-ration of new memberships. In addition, the proposed amendments introduce a new multi-year option which members have shown an interest in in accordance with other organizations like Mustang Club of America that also offer multi-year membership/renewal options.

Please review the proposed amendments on the next page. The proposed amendment will be voted on at the June 6th club meeting. In order to be approved and adopted, the amendment will need approval of two-thirds majority vote of the members present at the meeting.



Proposed Constitutional Amendment:

CURRENT CONSTITUTION WORDING:

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP, APPLICATION, DUES, AND TERMINATION

Section 3 DUES

A. The Executive Board shall recommend the amount for annual dues for the next year at the May monthly business meeting. The amount shall be approved by a two-thirds majority vote of members present at the May monthly business meeting.

1. Dues shall be payable on or before the October monthly business meeting.

2. Dues shall be pro-rated as determined by the Executive Board for new members only.

3. The Treasurer shall determine the method of payment of dues with approval of the Executive Board.

PROPOSED CONSTITUTION WORDING:

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP, APPLICATION, DUES, AND TERMINATION

Section 3 DUES

A. Annual membership terms shall start on the date in which the new member's annual dues payment is received, their application is approved by the Executive Board, and the Membership Chair has notified the new member of their membership approval.

1. Club members whose membership has lapsed for non-payment of dues will have a new renewal date coinciding with their payment of dues.

B. The Executive Board will offer multi-year membership options for annual dues consisting of 1-year, 2-year, and 3-year options with a cost benefit to members who select multi-year options.

 The Executive Board shall recommend changes to the amount for annual dues as needed, but no more than once per year at the January business meeting. The amount shall be presented to the membership and approved by a two-thirds majority vote of members present at the January monthly business meeting.
 Approval of new annual dues amounts will take effect immediately for prospective members, or at the time of renewal for current club members.

3. The Treasurer shall determine the method of payment of dues with approval of the Executive Board.

Proposed By-law Amendment:

CURRENT BY-LAWS WORDING:

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP, DUES
Section 3 DUES
A. Dues shall be payable on or before the October business meeting.
B. Dues shall be pro-rated for new members as determined by the executive board.

PROPOSED BY-LAWS WORDING:

ARTICLE IIMEMBERSHIP, DUESSection 3DUES

A. Dues shall be payable on or before the expiration date of a club member's current membership plan.

B. Dues shall consist of multi-year renewal options including 1-Year, 2-Year, and 3-Year options.

PCMC Carpet & Upholstery Tech Session Recap

This tech session had two separate parts: 1. Install a carpet on a 1969 coupe, and 2. recovering 1968 seat covers. As with all previous tech sessions, we met in the Knight's garage on Saturday, April 12. As usual, we had our obligatory donuts and coffee for starters.

The plan was for the carpet installation to go first, followed by a lunch break, and installing the seat covers after lunch. However, the carpet install had to be delayed so that under carpet speaker wires could be relocated. So the seat covers took precedence.

The seat backs were separated from the seat bottoms and old covers had already been removed. The new covers were warmed up in a different room to make the vinyl more pliable. The challenge to installing the covers is getting the hog rings to grab through the wire stays in the covers then the seat foam on to the wires on the seat frame.

While this was taking place, the speaker wires had been relocated, and we started on the carpet installation, concurrently. The challenge here, is to locate the exact cutouts for the gear selector opening and the floor dimmer switch on the front carpet, and the cutouts for the seat belt bolts on the rear carpet. Also, the holes for the seat rack mounting bolts had to be located. One trick to the cutouts is to use a hot soldering iron to do the cutting instead of a knife. This prevents the edges from unraveling.

We accomplished the objectives of the tech session, albeit without the scheduled lunch break. Thank you Dick for hosting the session, and all those who attended and helped out.







Little Trees Are Way Older Than You Think



"I got the trees on my mirror so my car won't smell," rapped Michael "Mike D" Diamond on the 1980s Beastie Boys cut "Slow Ride." I don't know why this line stuck out to me as a teenager, but as the 808 kick drums rattled the speakers in my 1994 Mazda Miata, I decided I needed to shell out a couple of bucks for a three pack of Black Ice Little Trees to hang on my



rearview. If it was cool enough for the Beastie Boys, it was cool enough for me.

Mike D got the basic concept but might not have been aware of the science behind the ubiquitous Little Tree. It's born from the work of Julius Sämann, a German–Jewish chemist who fled the Nazis and had studied the aromatic oils in Canada's pine forests.



In 1952, some 30 years a milkman in Watertown, New York, complained to Sämann about the spilt-milk smell in his truck. Two years later, Sämann filed a patent for blotter paper infused with "odor-destroying, air-perfuming substances." In the patent drawing, the air freshener took the shape of a buxom pin-up, but he ultimately landed on the familiar tree design. With the postwar boom in car ownership and Americans' love of puffing Pall Malls (more than half of the U.S. adult population smoked in the mid-1950s), Sämann's pines took off. The company is still familyowned today, and has expanded upon the original Royal Pine sent with 25 more fragrances, like Black Ice, New Car Scent, and Vanillaroma.

While that sounds like a lot smells to permeate your automobile, it's only a fraction of the fragrances that have been available over the years, as Little Trees is constantly updating its lineup.

According to the company's website, "To continue releasing new and exciting fragrances year after year, we unfortunately have to say goodbye to some that may not be as popular as they once were." For lovers of less popular trees, like Heat, Dew Kiss, and Bouquet, this statement is less than encouraging. Kevin Fielding, a reader from Utah, writes that the discontinuation of Bouquet is "one of the greatest travesties ever cast upon car culture." When he heard the bad news after contacting Little Trees, he bought one of the final remaining boxes of Bouquet Little Trees available on the internet.

It's a good thing Fielding stocked up when he did. Automobilia collectors get into bidding wars over rare and discontinued Little Trees, and the going rate today for a single Bouquet freshener on eBay is about \$40. Like with many aspects of the automotive landscape these days, fans of the diminutive pines show off their collections on online spaces like Reddit, TikTok, and YouTube. You might question the point of stashing vintage air fresheners, as it'd be reasonable to assume that fragrance would dissipate over time. But someone in the subreddit r/LittleTrees claims that new-old-stock fresheners from the 1980s still retain some smell when released from their cellophane wrappers.

Also unmentioned in that Beastie Boys song: the cellophane wrapper the Little Trees come in is not supposed to be immediately tossed in the garbage. According to the patent, the air freshener is supposed to be removed incrementally from the cellophane because "If the extent of withdrawal of the porous device from the pouch were left entirely to the judgment of the user, he might waste much of the volatile substance by excessive withdrawal of the member from the pouch, and the resulting strong odor might be displeasing to him." No wonder my Miata reeked of Black Ice.
