First, we are sad to report that Pediatric Interim Care Center did not receive funding in the Washington State 2026 Supplemental Budget. Without that funding and their former contract with DCYF, they are still unable to accept babies in their facility. Therefore, we will need to choose a new beneficiary for the proceeds from our 2026 Car Show.

Second, the Ford ASSET program was chosen as one of our 2025 beneficiaries, but has encountered some setbacks in re-starting the program at Shoreline Community College (formerly at Renton Technical College). With the future start date of the program uncertain, the PCMC Board felt it best to choose another beneficiary for our 2025 donations.

What is it?

Mission - To provide hope to our community by finding pathways to connect people, food, and resources, creating a meaningful and lasting impact for every neighbor. We envision a healthy community free of hunger and full of hope. Every day, we work tirelessly to get nourishing food and life-saving services to our neighbors in need.

What will PCMC donations support?

Market Style Food Bank - Every year, we distribute nearly one million pounds of food, including fresh milk, eggs, and produce. We proudly operate this 'grocery-style' food bank in line with the USDA MyPlate Nutrition Guide, which increases the opportunity to choose balanced and nutritious meals your family will enjoy!

Financial Assistance - We offer bus passes, rent help, and utility assistance programs for clients residing in Maple Valley, Black Diamond, and the boundaries of the Tahoma School District.

Outreach & Resource Services - In an effort to connect clients with comprehensive case management, we bring other agencies onsite to assist with employment opportunities, food stamps, affordable health care, and more. 2,371 individuals received emergency financial assistance for eviction prevention, utility disconnects, bus passes and other emergency needs.

Holiday Gift Program - Last year we provided 939 local children with gifts for Christmas morning. Each holiday season, we aim to support families in Maple Valley, Black Diamond, and the boundaries of the Tahoma School District.

Holiday Meal Program - Last holiday season we provided 1,070 families in Maple Valley, Black Diamond, and the boundaries of the Tahoma School District with specific Thanksgiving and Christmas meal baskets.

Feed a Tahomaie - Prevent student lunch debt by helping families who were denied FRL by providing lunch money directly to their lunch account and help students being withheld their diploma due to lunch debt.

Gardening Program - With a focus on fresh foods in our market, we are always grateful to receive produce from your gardens! Consider planting a row for the Food Bank or delivering excess produce to us!

JoyJars were created by Jessica Joy Rees who was diagnosed with terminal brain cancer at the age of 11 and sadly lost her battle at the age of 12. She created JoyJars as a way to bring joy to all the children she encountered in the hospital that were battling cancer like her. The Jessie Rees Foundation reaches kids via partnerships with children's hospitals, Ronald McDonald Houses, oncology camps and oncology centers. It also works with organizations and churches that reach children outside the U.S. The JoyJars are created by volunteers in the Irvine-based JoyFactory and through the Mobile JoyFactory, which travels nationwide to companies and organizations.

What will PCMC donations support?

Each JoyJar is age and gender specific and filled with new toys and activities to help a child actively fighting cancer smile and feel loved.

What is it?

Fisher House Foundation is best known for its network of more than 99 comfort homes where military and veteran families can stay at no cost while a loved one receives medical treatment. These homes are located at major military and VA medical centers nationwide, and in Europe, close to the medical center or hospital it serves. Since inception, the program has saved military and veteran families an estimated \$610 million in out-of-pocket costs for lodging and transportation. Fisher House Foundation also operates the Hero Miles Program, using donated frequent flyer miles to bring family members to the bedside of injured service members, and the Hotels for Heroes program using donated hotel points to allow family members to stay at hotels near hospitals.

We are continuing to prepare for our exciting June 14 Autocross at Sanderson Field in Shelton. Below is the latest information for a FUN day of driving and socializing!

- The event will be organized as a “FUN RUN”. Our Autocross will be non-competitive with no records kept. You will see your lap time displayed at the end of every run for 10 seconds. A perfect event for new and experienced Autocross drivers
- There will be 2 half-day sessions for up to 30 cars in each session. The morning session will be from 9am – NOON, with the afternoon session from 1pm to 4pm
- Drivers in each session should be able to get 4-6 runs in
- Cost will be only \$35 for each session to encourage participation
- There will be a driver’s meeting, track walk, and parade lap each session to help familiarize you with the course
- We plan to start registration for PCMC members around mid-March. Registration information and link will be emailed and on the club website
- IF we have space after PCMC members register, we will invite surrounding Mustang clubs to join us. Will open registration sometime in April.

MCA Regional Director's Meeting Recap

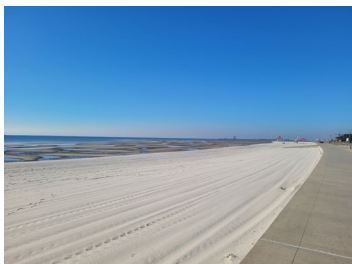

Modified Mustangs

Mustang Club of America shows are judged in several different ways. There are “concours” classes that are inspected for correct original parts and condition. Then they have two classes that cover personalized vehicles. They are daily driven and occasionally driven. These classes are mainly judged for workmanship and cleanliness.

Then there’s modified. Modified is judged the same but awards bonus points. While the aforementioned classes deduct points from the total available, modified adds points and must cross a minimum standard.

Here’s a general description of what the MCA considers modified:

1. Modified Mustangs are those that have been changed from Ford factory original, including but not limited to, sheet metal, paint, engine, interior, trunk, and undercarriage.
2. All class entries must be titled as Mustangs and have a Ford drivetrain.
3. Modified Mustangs are judged primarily for quality of workmanship, condition, and cleanliness, not authenticity, except Race/Drag classes which are President’s choice.
4. Modifications are a part or alteration that was NOT available as a Ford factory or dealer installed option, except for the cloned cars.
5. Determination will be made at the time of classification at each show if a Modified Mustang will be placed in modified class.

The other difference is that they award in gold, silver and bronze. This gets away from the first, second, third controversy. Awards are based on a points system judged against a standard rather than competing vehicles. This moves the focus onto your car as opposed to a competitors car.

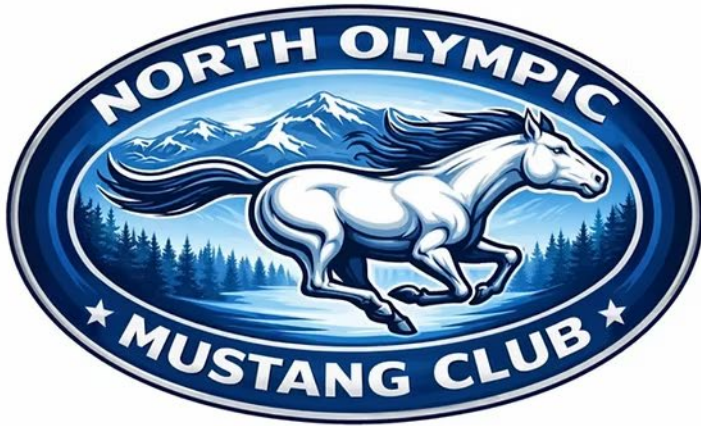

47th International Mustang Meet September 3rd - 7th, 2026 in Richmond BC Hosted by the Greater Vancouver Mustang Association

If you've ever considered attending the annual International Mustang Meet, IMM 47 will be right in our own backyard in Richmond BC (near Vancouver) next Labor Day Weekend Sept. 3-7, 2026). A Little History about the International Mustang Meet (thank you to Linda Hallberg) - The International Mustang Meet began in 1980 when two Mustangers, one American and one Canadian, met at a World of Wheels car show while each was showing a Mustang Convertible. They became best friends and thought it would be a great idea that an International Mustang Meet be held each year. They would start in Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada and then swap between the US and Canada each year. During that first year, there were three clubs and 75 cars, and the Labor Day weekend was chosen to allow for travel to the meet each year.

Today, the event has become more than a car show. There are 300-500 vehicles each year that gather on Labor Day weekend, and is a social event reuniting friendships made through the years. Friday night begins with a Welcome Party; Saturday is the show day followed by a BBQ in the evening. On Sunday there could be a special drive, potential Auto Cross or Poker Run, and ends with an Awards Banquet. Finally, we gather for breakfast on Monday morning and say goodbye until next year.

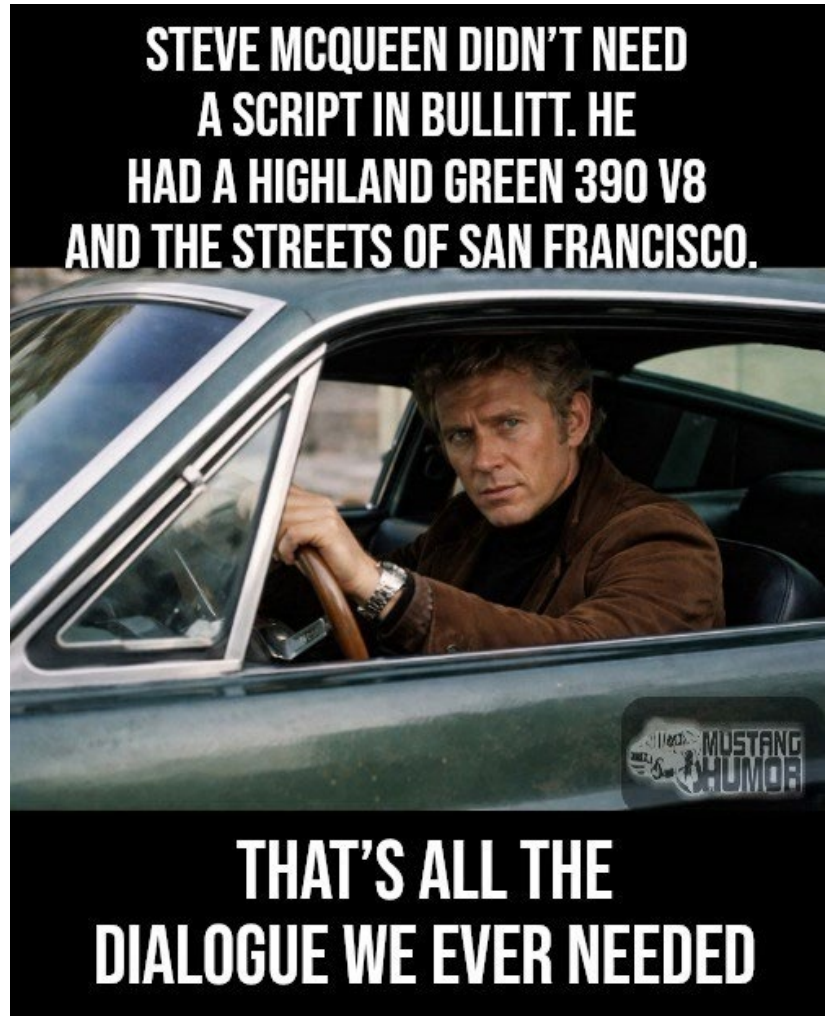
