We alternated walking the show field and cooling off inside the host hotel. We got together again, with Al Dyer, his niece and her husband for dinner. I had such a great time I forgot to get a group photo. Oh well.

Sunday we had breakfast and returned to the show field and had a nice conversation with some Tulsa local Mustangers. Then headed back to Oklahoma City to fly home. A good weekend overall. Thanks to Dick for being a great travel partner. I am looking forward to the next time.

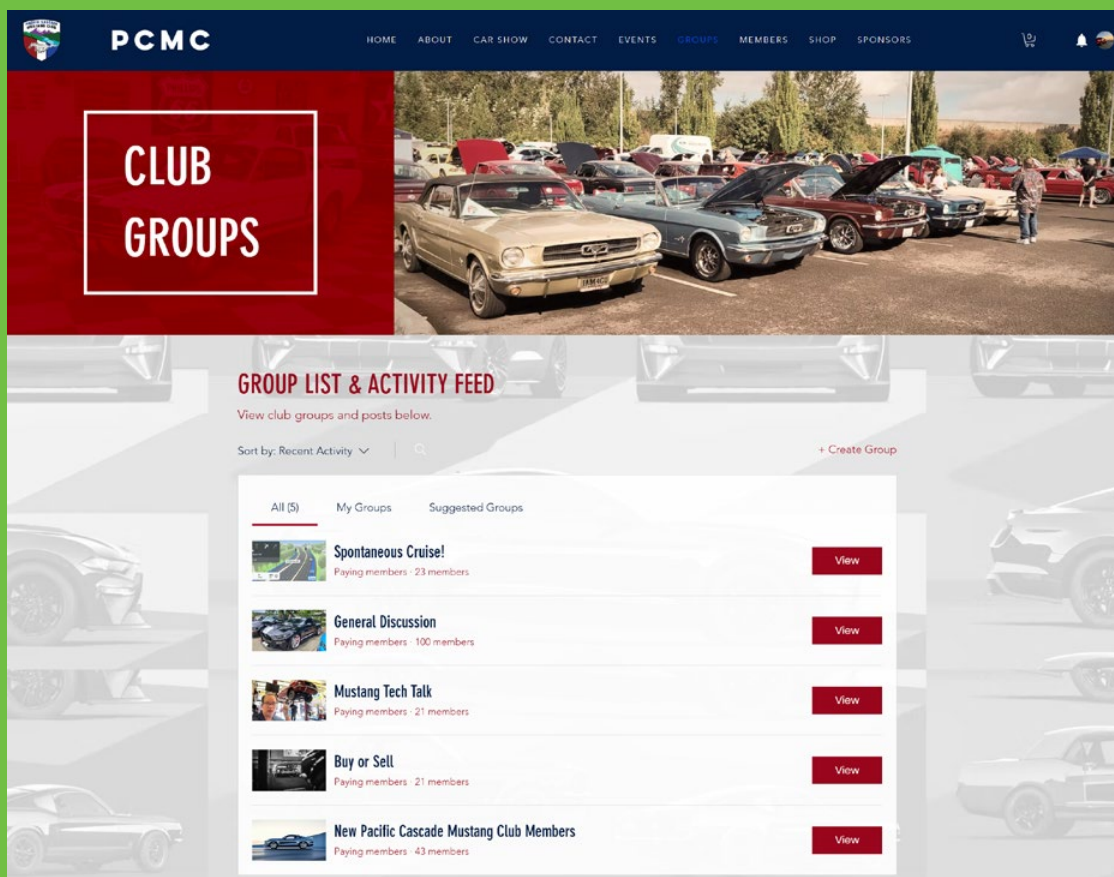

Guest speakers tonight were Carl Dodd, Director of Maple Valley Food Bank, and Mark Reeb, Power Brake Booster Exchange.

Carl Dodd, showed the Club the Maple Valley Food Bank's new van. This new van (which was sponsored by the Club) gives the Maple Valley Food Bank the opportunity to bring resources to people in need who may not be able to go to the food bank.

47th International Mustang Meet September 3rd - 7th, 2026 in Richmond BC Hosted by the Greater Vancouver Mustang Association

If you've ever considered attending the annual International Mustang Meet, IMM 47 will be right in our own backyard in Richmond BC (near Vancouver) next Labor Day Weekend Sept. 3-7, 2026). Several PCMC Members have attended IMMs in the past, to rave reviews. We have several club members who already have their cars registered and hotel booked for IMM 47. Details on a club caravan will be announced closer to the date next September.

A Little History about the International Mustang Meet (thank you to Linda Hallberg) - The International Mustang Meet began in 1980 when two Mustangers, one American and one Canadian, met at a World of Wheels car show while each was showing a Mustang Convertible. They became best friends and thought it would be a great idea that an International Mustang Meet be held each year. They would start in Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada and then swap between the US and Canada each year. During that first year, there were three clubs and 75 cars, and the Labor Day weekend was chosen to allow for travel to the meet each year.

Today, the event has become more than a car show. There are 300-500 vehicles each year that gather on Labor Day weekend, and is a social event reuniting friendships made through the years. Friday night begins with a Welcome Party; Saturday is the show day followed by a BBQ in the evening. On Sunday there could be a special drive, potential Auto Cross or Poker Run, and ends with an Awards Banquet. Finally, we gather for breakfast on Monday morning and say goodbye until next year.

2029 Ford Mustang Mach-4 Sedan: Everything We Know About the Next Member of the Mustang Family

What It Is

At this point, it's less a rumor and more a waiting game. Ford has made it clear in both private meetings and on-the-record interviews it intends to get back into making cars other than the Mustang coupe. In other words, the company wants to extend the "Mustang family," as executives call it. A four-door Mustang sedan concept has already been shown to dealers earlier this year, and the company trademarked the name "Mach-4," which follows the Mustang Mach-E naming convention.

Why It Matters

The whole "Mustang family" thing isn't new, either, and the Mach-E was never meant to be a one-off. Ford sees the Mustang and Bronco not as individual models anymore but as subbrands ripe for expansion. That's why there's a little Bronco Sport and an electric Mustang Mach-E. The Mach-4 is how Ford will continue to grow the Mustang subbrand. It's also how Ford gets back into building sedans without having to spend too much money or build (or rebuild) a new brand from scratch.

On the first point, modifying the existing S650 Mustang chassis, while not cheap, will cost less than engineering an all-new rear-drive car platform. Ford execs want this program to be cost-effective, and working with what you have is generally cheaper. Figuring out how to stretch the unibody will take a lot more than sawing the car in half and adding metal in between, but ideally, it'll be less work than starting from nothing. If that plan pencils out, it will also help get the car to market sooner.

On the second point, the Mach-E already proved most customers care more about looking cool than preserving the sanctity of the Mustang name. The EV crossover regularly outsells the gas-powered coupe by a wide margin, and the Mustang name and looks were always intended to increase its appeal, which is precisely what happened. Ford plans to pull the same trick twice with the Mach-4 sedan. Plus, people already know what a Mustang is, so the marketing department doesn't have to dust off an old, forgotten nameplate or invent a new one and then try to convince buyers to take a chance on it.

Platform and Powertrain

We're confident the Mach-4 will be a modified Mustang coupe. The Mustang already has four seats, so two more doors and some rear legroom are all it really needs here. While it's possible the Mach-4 could herald the coming of a next-generation Mustang platform the coupe would also move to, we think it's unlikely given everything Ford execs have said about keeping costs down. It's also worth remembering that the existing S650 platform is just an evolution of the old S550 one, not an all-new bit of engineering. It's possible that when Ford updated the S550 to the S650, it baked in some of what would be needed to do a sedan.

Further toward keeping costs down, we don't expect the powertrains to change. That means the 2.3-liter turbo four-cylinder and 10-speed auto is likely to be the standard setup, with the 5.0-liter V-8 optional and paired with either the 10-speed auto or six-speed manual.

Wait, do we really think Ford would do a V-8 sedan with a manual transmission? Yes. The V-8 is a lock as far as we're concerned now that Dodge has confirmed the Charger will get a V-8. A manual transmission option will give the Mach-4 a unique selling proposition that Dodge can't currently match. Because the V-8 and manual transmission combination is already engineered for the Mustang platform, the incremental cost of emissions certification, calibration, and crash validation in the revised bodyshell should be manageable.
