



Ford's Three-Valve V8—Can It Be Saved?





ord's Modular SOHC V8 was introduced in the 1991 Lincoln Town Car and 1992 Ford Crown Victoria and Mercury Grand Marquis. A 32-valve 4.6L DOHC screamer arrived in the Lincoln Mark VIII in 1993. The Modular wouldn't arrive in the Mustang until 1996 in the GT (SOHC) and the SVT Cobra (DOHC). When I saw this engine for the first time at the 1991 Ford Long Lead in Dearborn, I thought Ford had lost its mind. It was a radical departure from the small- and big-block pushrod V8s.

The 4.6L—and later 5.4L engines for F-Series trucks in 1997—were a new generation of overhead cam V8 engines that have carried Ford and its customers well into the new millennium. These engines are rugged workhorses and have proven themselves for police work, taxicabs, delivery vehicles, F-Series trucks, and the Mustang GT. At first, the Modular V8

took some getting used to. It was nothing like our previous small-block and big-block engines. It loved to rev and spun like a wild child under hard acceleration with a smoothness we had never seen before.

Ford's Modular engine family was produced in two plants-Romeo, Michigan, and Windsor (Essex), Ontario, Canada. Romeo produced the 4.6L engines in the early 1990s with a slightly different approach to design than Windsor that came online in 1997 to produce a more heavy-duty 4.6L and larger 5.4L engine for trucks including the all-new 1997 F-Series, again using a different design approach than Romeo, making interchangeability tricky between the two plants. Even with all of its engineering and product planning experience, Ford blundered terribly with two plants and two engines with vastly different approaches to the same engine family.

TECH TALK

THREE-VALVES

Though we like and respect the two- and four-valve Modular engines, the troublesome three-valve Modular V8 introduced in 2004 has been a source of frustration and expense for many of us. Ford's objective was to make more power with two intake valves and one exhaust with Variable Cam Timing (VCT), which was a nice refinement, yet it has been fraught with durability and failure issues.

Though 3V engines take in healthy amounts of air and fuel to make power, these engines have been failing with regularity. The internet forums are bursting with horror stories addressing catastrophic 3V engine failures. Anytime automakers introduce a new engine or driveline innovation, there are bound to be teething issues that must be addressed. The 3V is no exception.



ABOVE & BELOW: The 3V cylinder heads are radically different than the 2V and 4V castings. Where they differ most are the unique three-valve chambers with two intake valves and one exhaust, with the spark plug in the middle for a thorough light-off and less chance of detonation. The 3V's block is virtually the same as the 2V offering the same rugged durability.



If you own a 2005-10 Mustang GT or an F-Series truck, Expedition, or Navigator with the 3V Modular engine, you have undoubtedly experienced timing component and valvetrain failure, sometimes with catastrophic results. The 3V engine's key issue is valvetrain lubrication. Because Variable Cam Timing (VCT) calls for a lot of oil volume and pressure for proper camshaft phaser function, the valvetrain suffers from insufficient lubrication. These critical parts become oilstarved and fail. Weaknesses include insufficient oil volume and pressure from the stock oil pump; cam Phaser failure due to internal weaknesses and return spring failure; roller follower oil holes too large, bleeding off oil volume and pressure; chain tensioner seal failure and loss of oil pressure; and VCT solenoid issues.

THE SOLUTION

The solution is to replace and upgrade your 3V's valvetrain system and oil pump. You're going to need the following parts. Expect to spend somewhere around \$2,000 in parts aloneand they must all be Ford Performance or Ford Motorcraft replacement parts, with the exception being the Melling oil pump and Fel-Pro gaskets and seals. We are learning that aftermarket timing and roller followers tend to fail and should be avoided until they can get the kinks worked out.

Summit Racing Equipment and Ford Performance Parts make it easy to get everything you need for your 3V timing job, which consists of the front timing components from Ford Performance Parts/Ford Motorcraft.

- Cam Phasers
- VCT Solenoids
- Timing Chains
- Chain Guides (4)
- Chain Tensioners (2 Left and Right Specific)
- Crank Sprocket
- Crank Trigger Wheel (Reluctor)
- Crank Seal
- Timing Cover Gasket Kit
- Oil Pan Gasket (Drop the oil pan for cleaning)



These are the timing components you will need to bring the front-end up to date. Order the complete Ford Performance Parts kit from Summit Racing Equipment (www.summitracing.com) and get prompt service with genuine Ford parts.



These are the revised cam phasers currently available from Ford with engineering refinements that make them more durable. Oil pressure is applied to the phaser, which advances valve timing for power under acceleration. A watch spring-style return spring retards timing back to center. The drive pins tend to fail in the original 3V phasers.

TECH TALK

You're also going to need the M-6529-3V Ford Performance Roller Follower kit with the upgraded oil jets (smaller hole) that conserve oil volume and pressure, getting oil directly onto the roller for improved lubrication. Add to that the Fel-Pro valve cover gaskets (VS-50687-R), Fel-Pro Oil Pan Gasket (OS-30725-R), and Permatex's "The Right Stuff" for the valve and timing cover joints.

Another issue we don't think of enough is cylinder head gaskets. Modulars of all types struggle with blown head gaskets, which is common with dissimilar metals like cast-iron blocks and aluminum heads. Few things are more discouraging than blown head gaskets or cylinder sealing issues when you've done all of this work. You will need the Fel-Pro #26306 PT (left) and #26307 PT (right) head gaskets. You will also need new head bolts (torque-angle/torque-to-yield) from Ford or aftermarket bolts from ARP.

If you desire a thicker head gasket, opt for Fel-Pro's #26710 PT (left) and #26711 (right), which are 0.010-inch thicker than those just mentioned. You also have the option of Fel-Pro's Head Set Kit #HS 26306 PT-2 that has everything you will need for gasket replacement fulfillment.

We like Fel-Pro for its solid reputation, specifically designed for repair/replacement projects and offering reliable sealing on even the most problematic applications because they work well with imperfect sealing surfaces. While the heads are off, have a qualified machine shop check valve seating and condition, along with valve seal and spring replacement.



This is a close-up of the cam phaser return spring, which is one weakness in the original cam phasers. The spring fails and the cam phaser doesn't return



This is the VCT advance solenoid (there are two, one for each bank), which is signaled by the PCM to advance cam timing. These solenoids can stick, causing engine roughness and power loss. They stick primarily with engines that don't get regular oil changes. You must run 5W3O synthetic engine oil even though Ford suggests 5W2O, which is not thick enough. Mobil I synthetic is suggested along with a Wix or Ford Motorcraft filter.





ABOVE: One of two plastic/composite timing chain tensioners, which are controlled with engine oil pressure to keep timing chains firm against the guides. The iron tensioners (not pictured) have ratchet mechanisms to lock tension in with or without oil pressure.

BELOW: These are the three roller followers (rocker arms), three per cylinder, that actuate two intake valves and one exhaust. These are the original 3V followers, which have the large oil holes that bleed off oil pressure and starve the oiling system, which can cause engine damage.



The Melling M340HV oil pump delivers what the stock Ford pump does not-increased volume and pressure to keep valvetrain parts happy. There is also the M-360HV pump for severe duty applications, with 80 psi maximum pressure, which most of you will not want or need. The 80 psi maximum pressure doesn't mean this pump maintains 80 psi all the time.

The revised Ford roller followers (rocker arms) have a smaller oil passage than the 3V's original followers, which had a larger oil hole that vented excessive oil volume and pressure. The smaller oil passage delivers velocity and is aimed directly at the roller. When you order a set, make sure you are getting the revised followers with nearly invisible oil holes located at the lash adjuster cup.

It is also important that you get the upgraded cam phasers mentioned above, which have been beefed up to handle the stresses of VCT. Everything else, including chain guides, tensioners, timing chains, sprockets, and VCT solenoids, is virtually the same. Use only Ford Performance or Ford Motorcraft parts.

And finally, the plastic tensioners have a history of seal failure, which we are not certain Ford has addressed. The iron tensioners used on the 2V and 4V Modulars will work on the 3V engine, and there's no seal to worry about. The issue with iron tensioners is the ratcheting mechanism that locks the tensioner against the chain guides. The 3V's plastic tensioners do not lock and are held against the chain guides with oil pressure alone. Builders tell us the tensioner locking feature can put too much stress on the chains, causing premature wear (chain stretch).


PARTS REPLACEMENT

Replacing these valvetrain components is an enormous job involving a significant amount of labor and know-how. It is not a job for the novice. If you farm out this job out to a repair shop, confirm they have experience with the Modular engines as well as the DOHC Coyote V8 and get a written estimate. Be prepared for hidden surprises (damage) when they tear it apart. This is not a task for the average mechanic.

If you're going to tackle this job yourself, get all of your parts in place ahead of time. Few things are worse than discovering the parts needed are on backorder. Before getting started, take pictures of everything as installed as a visual reference for when it is time to put it all back together. If you are tenacious and committed, you can do this job yourself. But never kid yourself. This is not an easy undertaking.

Before getting started, inspect everything under the hood, including the cooling system, cylinder heads and gaskets, spark plugs and coils, sensors, electrical connections, and just about anything else that could land you behind a tow truck unexpectedly.

It is suggested you check compression (static compression) and cylinder leak-down (working compression) before tearing into this engine. If you don't have the tools necessary to confirm cylinder sealing, have a trusted shop check these pressures and confirm their findings in writing. Few things are worse than a tear-down to find serious wear issues and the need for a new engine.



This is the revised M-6529-3V roller follower (also known as a "finger" follower). Note the difference in the smaller oil hole, which is not visible in this image. It is a tiny oil jet pointed toward the roller for improved lubrication and greater oil volume and pressure for the rest of the engine. This is the follower you want.

If your 3V has more than 200,000 miles or you're not disciplined with oil changes, it makes more sense to rebuild or replace the engine. Two remanufacturers are suggested, Jasper Engines and Powertrain Products, both of which deliver great products and offer a warranty.

Modern high-tech engines like the Modular and the Coyote do not tolerate neglect. Ditto for Ford's 2.3L and 3.5L EcoBoost engines. If you're sloppy about oil and filter changes and cooling system maintenance, it will bite you in the posterior. Most engine failures I have witnessed have been due to neglect and abuse.


The best advice I can offer is the use of synthetic lubrication and the best oil filters with a filter magnet to capture ferrous metals. Wix, K&N, and Mobil 1 oil filters are the best filters. I've been using Mobil 1 5W30 for 26 years with outstanding results and zero wear. Follow this routine and you can expect over 200,000 miles of service.

As a first line of defense, pick up a copy of George Reid's How To Rebuild 4.6L & 5.4L Ford Engines for basic information on these engines, including the 3V, and arm yourself with the appropriate Ford Shop Manual for your year and model. These publications will give you a good information foundation.





This is the Melling M34OHV high-volume oil pump for the 3V Modular. It delivers both volume and pressure without overdoing the pressure. Before you install this pump, remove the cover but not the rotor, and fill the cavity with engine assembly lube for a good slippery start-up and a positive prime of the oiling system. It is good common sense to remove the oil pan for cleaning and the installation of a new pickup.



CarTech's How To Rebuild 4.6L & 5.4L Ford Engines was published a few years ago with a more recent reprint and update. It is an excellent basic information book on the Modular engine family, including the 3V. Adding a Ford Shop Manual to your reference library completes the set.






