Autocross with Bridge City Autosports

Are you interested in participating in or learning more about autocross? Bridge City Autosports (BCA) hosts several autocross events each year with the goal of helping people learn and gain valuable skills in vehicle control and command. All skills levels are welcome, from novice to expert.

BCA is hosting an autocross on Saturday and Sunday, August 30th/31st at Sanderson Field in Shelton WA. If you're interested in participating, feel free to reach out to PCMC member Reid Stromberg with questions at rrstromberg13@gmail.com.

Cost is \$45 per day or \$85 for both.

Saturday will have two run groups. Group A and Group B.

- 7am gates open for check in, tech inspection and course walks.
- 8:30 is mandatory drivers meeting
- 9am Group A start driving, Group B works course.
- 10:30ish swap to Group B driving, Group A working
- 12:30ish lunch
- 1:30ish Group A drive, B work
- 3ish swap
- 5ish open for fun runs

Fun runs are for those who want to stick around and get more runs in - you have to shag your own cones. Basically, cross the finish, turn around and drive out to pick up any cones you hit, one car at a time.

Saturday night is our second annual Labor Day potluck on site. There's a link to sign up for dishes and such during registration.

Sunday morning schedule is the same, and we will have either two or three run groups depending on turnout. People will either work/run, or work/run/rest in some order. Each driving session will be longer than Saturday, but there is no lunch break and everybody only runs one time. Done by usually around 2pm, then we open up for fun runs and people can leave if they want to.

Tech inspection list is here. Emphasis on checking lug nuts, and making sure the battery is tied down. https://www.bcautosports.club/bca-rules/tech-inspection/.



Registration is here: http://bcautosports.motorsportreg. com. Registration is open until the day of the event, or it's full, whichever is sooner.

Camping is permitted on site, in vehicles, in tents, RVs, etc. There are no amenities except for Porta potties. Please do not park on the grass. Dogs remain on leash, there are coyotes around.

Passengers are permitted, they must be 13 or older and must have a helmet that fits, and fit in the seat with seatbelt. We have loaner helmets for drivers who don't have helmets.

Bridge City Autosprots can easily have someone lead a novice course walk to talk people through the course. We can arrange that and after people get checked in and complete tech inspection, they can gather and go on the walk, 7:45 would be good for that. They will want to walk the course more than once, and it is almost a mile long.

Drivers will pick a car number from the drop-down menu during registration. I suggest to sign up in novice if they don't know what class they are in, novices drive second and get to watch the course for the first session. Another option is nfp, not for points. But they always drive first, so no advantage of watching course first.

We will have tape on site for car numbers if people don't have them, they can get that during Tech inspection.

Saturday morning we finished up the Mach1 and checked to see if our third car, another Boss 429, had arrived. It didn't show up so our work day ended. We were free to walk around and enjoy the show. Even though the temperature was hot and the humidity was high, it was a great time and I look forward to the next time.

















Meeting Minutes: 6/6/2025

Meeting called to order at 7:04 pm by President Pro Tempore Brian Remmel. Gary Dagan motioned to approve May meeting minutes. Warren McPhearson seconded. Motion approved.

PRESIDENT: Brian Remmel outlined the proposed amendment to the PCMC Constitution and By-Laws in the newsletter. 2 primary changes -- the first proposes that annual memberships start and end on the date the member officially joins the club. The second change offers multi-year membership options so members can sign up for or renew for 1, 2, or 3 years with a cost savings for multiple years. Brian reviewed pros and cons, and opened the floor for discussion. The amendment was voted on and approved unanimously.

Brian introduced special guests Joe and Kody Kimball, who own Kimball's Hands On Detailing in Gig Harbor. They provide services ranging from detailing to custom builds, and auto transport. Joe has been in the detailing business for 35 years and Kimball's has been in business for 6 years. The Kimballs provided an instructional overview of everything from paint correction to ceramic coating to paint protection film. Q&A followed from club members about best products and practices for their vehicles. Brian will create a "car care corner" group on the PCMC website so club members can ask the Kimballs car care questions. The Kimballs also offered 10% off to PCMC members.

Brian also reviewed some new features on the PCMC website, including Groups. The member roster is now available online as well, and is searchable for anything including name and car. Note you must be logged into the website in order to view the roster. Members can also control the information they share in the roster by going to their profile and making items private or public.

TREASURER: John Chudy said lots of money is coming in for the car show from registrations and sponsorships.

TOURS & EVENTS: Margaret Petersen listed upcoming events: 6/13 dinner at BBQ Pete's, Cruise Puyallup & Binford's, and the Sovren Races on Saturday July 5th. Tickets for the races can be purchased tonight or on the PCMC website. She also mentioned upcoming Autocross events for anyone who may be interested in participating.

MEMBERSHIP: Cheryl Grant introduced new and prospective members including James Harper who owns

a 69 Mach 1, and Jesse and Ashley Smith who own a 68 convertible.

CLUB STORE: Cheryl Grant announced that pre-orders are extended to June 8th for anyone hoping to get in on the first batch of new club swag.

PEGASUS: Tiffany Dagan thanked John Chudy, Gary Dagan, and Marsh Frillici for contributing to the June Pegasus with articles and photos.

TECH: Dick Knight is planning a tech session on starting cars that haven't run in a long time. More info to come.

CAR SHOW: Dick Knight said the first allotment of flyers is out. He reminded members to sign up in the Volunteer Book. They especially need help with parking. He also asked members to help gather raffle prizes and gooody bag items. He also announced that Brian Grant will be taking over as Car Show Coordinator next year.

Eleanor, the "Gone In 60 Seconds" Mustang, Is Back. Want One? That'll be \$500K

For nearly 40 years, Ray Claridge owned Cinema Vehicle Services, a company he sold in 2016.

During those four decades, CVS built "literally thousands of vehicles, and 99 percent of them were for movies and television," Claridge says. Such as: The General Lee for The

Dukes of Hazzard. He built the cars for the Terminator movies, for the Die Hard series. He even built Herbie the Love Bug for the last incarnation of that character.

Since he sold his company, Claridge has been working on other, non-automotive projects, and he still does a little consulting work. But he describes himself as "semi-retired." Until now.

What project would bring Claridge, 76, back to a full-time gig that will last at least a year, maybe 18 months?

Eleanor.

"I can't think of anything else I'd be interested in," Claridge says. He and his company built the Eleanor Ford Mustangs used in the Nicholas Cage/ Angelina Jolie remake of Gone In 60 Seconds, which was released in June of 2000, 25 years ago this month.

This has been made possible by the ruling a month ago by a three-judge panel for the United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit. It decreed that Eleanor was not a character in the movie. KITT, the talking Pontiac Firebird in the Knight Rider TV series, was arguably a character, but Eleanor was just a car. As Claridge says, "It's the difference between an entity and a prop," and Eleanor was ruled to be a prop. The decision was in regard to a lawsuit filed by Denice Halicki, the widow of H.B. Halicki, who wrote, directed, and starred in the original Gone in 60 Seconds, released in 1974. She hoped to retain the rights to Eleanor, which was played by a 1971 Ford Mustang in the original film.

Claridge "wasn't even aware the case was still in the courts," he says. But once the judges handed down their decision, things happened quickly. Randy Wolff, CEO of Cinema Muscle Recreations, the company that's financing the project, put the wheels in motion that resulted in the reunion of members of the original build team.

And now he has the opportunity to build 25 Eleanors, to commemorate the 25th anniversary of the movie. He has gotten most of his original team back together to build the cars, which have a starting price of \$500,000. Check every option box and you'll be just under \$550,000.

Perhaps you'd like to replace the base 480-horsepower Ford Coyote V-8 with



a 427-cubic-inch, 550-horsepower Roush V-8? That'll be \$18,000. But maybe you should go ahead and get the 5.2-liter Ford Aluminator V-8, and add a big Whipple supercharger, because 875 horsepower sounds about right. It's a bargain at \$19,500.

But you'll probably want to upgrade from the five-speed Tremec manual transmission to the six-speed; please add \$4500. Eighteen-inch tires and wheels (\$7500) are required if you want the six-piston Wilwood front disc brakes (\$2000). Leather upholstery instead of vinyl? That's \$7500. Our imaginary car is adding up fast.

Claridge and his team built 11 Eleanor Mustangs for the film; seven survived, and Claridge owned them, eventually selling them to collectors: "I know where every one of them is."

Getting much of the original team back together, including shop manager Sam Salerno, who led the hands-on team that built the original Eleanors, "was the deciding factor for me," Claridge says. "They put their heart and soul into those original cars, and we'll be doing the same with these."

That said, what Claridge doesn't want is the thrash that became the build process for the original movie cars. From the time producer Jerry Bruckheimer approved the design for Eleanor, "We had six weeks to build and deliver the cars," Claridge says. "It was one of the craziest programs I've ever worked on."

For this anniversary build, they'll have something they didn't have then: Time to finesse the details. Each car begins with a 1967 Mustang donor car. Claridge figures it will take at least a year to finish those 25 cars, and they're already well along on the first one, which should be finished in six or eight weeks. "These cars are going to be damn near hand-built," Claridge says. "I'm not just lending my name to it, I'm in charge of quality control. If a car is not where it needs to be, it's not going out the door. If I'm putting my name on a car, it has to be what I want it to be."

Once they finish the anniversary cars, they will likely keep building Eleanors if the demand is there, perhaps 60 total. But only the first 25 will carry the anniversary special-edition designation.


