Rally to Save PICC

Saturday, October 4th - 9:30am at Kent Station

If you ever wanted to make a difference, the time is now!

For the first time in 35 years, the cribs in our beautiful nursery at Pediatric Interim Care Center (PICC) are empty. Our state contract to receive infants needing transitional medical care was cancelled, along with our state appropriation. This is happening during an unprecedented crisis: more babies are dying from fentanyl poisoning in drug-involved homes than ever before.

But it's not too late. Together, we can save PICC and protect the most vulnerable babies in our community — if we stand up, speak out, and make our voices heard. That's why this year's Walk for the Babies is not about fundraising. It's about raising support and rallying for letters to legislators demanding that PICC's state appropriation and contract be restored.

What You Can Do

Register — Sign up as an individual, family, group, or team to rally and march for PICC.

Write Your State Legislators — and gather more letters from friends and family. All the help you need is on the Letters Page.

Rally & March — Meet us at Kent Station at 9:30 a.m., rally at 10, then march to PICC and deliver your letters for counting and mailing.

Celebrate — Return to Kent Station for drawings, thank-you prizes, and Duke's chowder.

Why It Matters

Your participation in the rally followed by your impactful and personal letters of support will tell our lawmakers directly: their constituents care deeply about the survival of PICC and the protection of drug-exposed infants. Babies' lives depend on their action.

Pacific Cascade Mustang Club's 38th Annual All Ford Show & Mustang Roundup

On Sunday, August 17th we had our 38th annual car show at the accesso ShoWare Center in Kent. The weather was absolutely great for a car show: temperature mid 70s and partly sunny. We had 282 preregistered cars, and 70 the day-of registrants, for a total of 352 registrations.

The car show itself went very well, with 54 classes and an assortment of cars ranging from early Fords to vintage Mustangs to the latest Mustangs and Shelybs.

We also had the Kent Police and Firefighters at the show, as well as hydroplane on display, courtesy of the Hydroplane Museum. We also had a number of vendors and food trucks on site. We also had a huge raffle, that included an \$800 discount on tires, sponsored by Bowen Scarff Ford.

Once everybody was registered and parked, the show began with the presentation of the colors by Scouts from troop 406/4406. They did a great job, and looked sharp.

As a new community outreach this year we had the Maple Valley food bank in attendance, who accepted non-perishable food and cash donations. Additionally they got half of the split-the-pot (50/50) proceeds, which raised an additional \$800+ dollars for them. Unfortunately, we did not have Pediatric Interim Care Center, PICC in attendance this year. Due to new WA State rules and loss of state funding, PICC is not currently able to accept drug addicted babies for rehabilitation. Although they have enough funds to continue operations until the end of the year, had to cease operations. Over the years, PCMC has donated well over \$80,000 to this worthy cause.

Old Business:

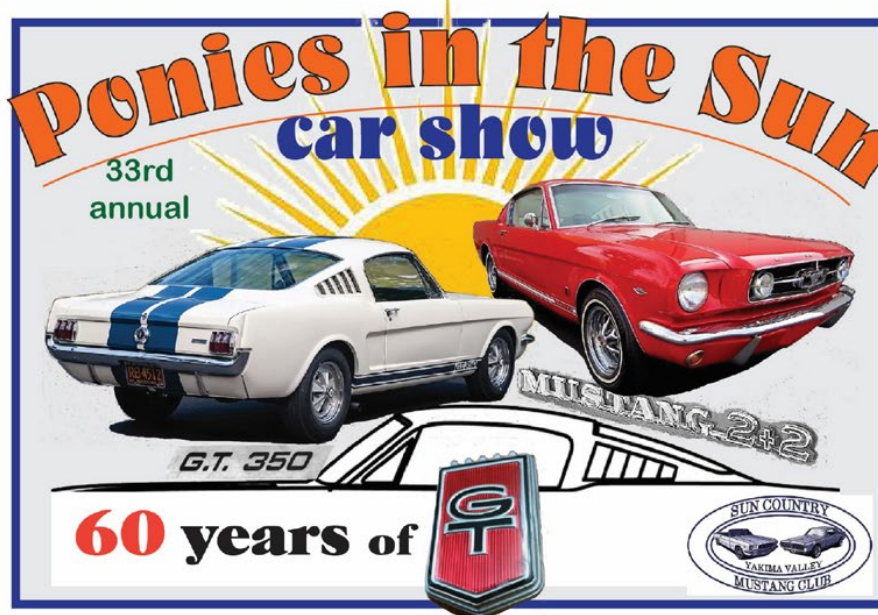

Jay Leno Drives His Mustang GTD with Jim Farley

Ford made major waves when it announced that it would produce a \$300,000 Mustang. The GTD would be the road-going counterpart to the race-only Mustang GT3, and the two would share a lot of design elements. It was just as exciting when Ford

announced that the GTD had run a Nurburgring lap time under seven minutes. Jay Leno was lucky enough to get one of the first production GTDs, #12 in fact, to match his two Ford GTs, and his latest video includes his first impressions with his new ride.

Delivering Jay's Mustang GTD is none other than Ford CEO Jim Farley. Farley is a racer himself and gives us all the rundown on the hardware and development of this limited-production, street-legal track machine. Jay's GTD is equipped with the Performance Pack that adds some aerodynamic enhancements, including the Drag Reduction System (DRS). Farley and Leno go over some of the advantages the production GTD has over its GT3 racing counterpart, DRS included. The two also discuss the unique rear suspension, the rear-mounted transaxle, and the unique packaging of all of the GTD's race-bred components before heading out on the road.

One of Leno's first comments about the 815hp cars is that it's "way more civilized than I thought it would be." The city driving proves just how buttoned-down the GTD can be, but even when it's not on the track, the DRS system and pushrod suspension are putting in work. The DRS can be seen activating in the background, and the suspension's movement is easy to see through the polycarbonate window installed for just that reason.

Leno took it easy on his first drive of his new GTD, as it has a 250-mile break-in period. Still, it must have been tempting to open the car up a bit on the winding canyon roads that he selected for his drive. It's one impressive machine, and the fact that a big company like Ford could focus their effort on such a niche vehicle is amazing. As Farley said, "These projects come down to people," and without true enthusiasts like Farley pulling the strings behind the scenes, we'd never get a Mustang that's as capable and versatile as the GTD.
