Rally to Save PICC Cancelled

We're sad to report that the Rally to Save PICC has been cancelled, but PICC is still very much in need of our support. Your letters to your Washington State legislators are the most powerful way to help restore PICC's ability to provide care and protection for drug-exposed infants. Following is a guide from PICC:

Write Your Letters to Save PICC and Protect Infants

PICC's state contract and funding were cancelled. For the first time in 35 years, our nursery cribs are empty. At the same time, fentanyl is killing more babies in drug-involved homes than ever before. We must act now. Your letters to your Washington State legislators are the most powerful way to help restore PICC's ability to provide care and protection for drug-exposed infants. It only takes a few minutes.

Step 1 – Find Your Washington State Legislators (not Congressional) by entering your address at the link below.

Click on your district's state senator (1) and representatives (2) to find their names and mailing addresses (P.O. Box). For extra credit, you can also send a copy of your letter to Governor Bob Ferguson, Office of the Governor, PO Box 40002, Olympia, WA 98504-0002

Step 2 – Write Your Letters

Your letter doesn't need to be long. Even 3 sentences make a difference. *If PICC touched your life, please share your story or explain why you care. This is the part that will give your letter impact.* These templates provide a general idea of the points to stress but make the letter your own.

Simple Version (3–4 sentences)

Dear [Legislator],

I care deeply about drug-exposed newborns. PICC has given a safe and healthy start to more than 3,500 babies over the past 35 years. Please restore funding and placements for PICC in the next legislative session.

Thank you, [Your Name]

Expanded Version (with talking points)

Dear [Legislator],

As your constituent, I urge you to protect drug-exposed infants.

- These babies are among the most vulnerable in our community.
- PICC is the only transitional care center for newborns across the Puget Sound.
- Over 35 years, PICC has given a safe start to 3,500+ infants and supported thousands of families.
- Defunding PICC and cancelling placements was a grave mistake.
- The legislature must act in the next session to restore PICC.

Step 3 – Ask friends and family to write letters, too! You can share these instructions with them. Every letter shows our legislature that someone cared so deeply that they took the time and care to make their voice heard. Let's make sure they hear our voices loud and clear.

What is an Autocross?

It's a sport I tried once and was hooked for over twenty years, competing mostly in Washington State, Oregon and occasionally in California. The Mustang I drove was our 69 Mach I. Autocross events are still held all across the United States.

An autocross tests the driver's skill while driving in a large parking lot or on a track. The design of the course emphasizes the driver's ability to maneuver their car in and out of a series of corners. Scoring is based on elapsed time required to complete the course while adding penalties when an orange cone is hit.



Preparing for the event, you need to make sure the car is well maintained, has enough gas, the oil level is sufficient and your battery is tied down. You'll be required to remove all loose items from the inside of the car and trunk. Another key step is to inflate the tires, especially the front tires, to their maximum recommended pressure as indicated on the sidewall. Autocross events happen rain or shine. Dress for the weather and wear proper shoes for walking or running the course.

Registration varies from club to club. When you arrive at the event you will be required to sign a liability waiver. Make sure you have your driver's license available. You will be provided with a map of the course to study and use during your walk through. Next step is to empty out your vehicle. Then proceed to the technical inspection area. Most events require participants to work and help the event run smoothly but not always.

For safety you are required to have a factory-installed seatbelt and a helmet which you can borrow at the event. Novice drivers who are out for a good time and the serious competitor can attend the same event. These two drivers will not be on the course together. Depending on the size of the course only one car is allowed on the course at one time competing against the clock. Walking the course is crucial!

For the first-timer it can be overwhelming, so talk and walk with an experienced person. A first-time auto crosser should have only two goals: be successful and safely complete the course without penalty and have fun!

The proposed date for a Club Autocross is June 14, 2026 at Sanderson Field in Shelton. Attend this Friday's business meeting, October 3rd to hear the proposal, voice your opinion or ask for further details.

Starting a Dead Car

It was a very good day and fun for sure! After a 30 minute in-depth discussion on the the attack at hand we got started.... Drained the old fuel and oil, checked the radiator level, cleared and primed the fuel lines, added new oil and gasoline as well as filters, Added new battery, points & condenser, rotor, distributor cap, spark plug wires and plugs (pre-checked and double checked plug gap). We also checked other misc. wiring, oil gauge and coil functionality etc as well. We did an inspection of the interior of the compression chambers of each cylinder with a Bore Scope as well as running a compression test of each cylinder before installing the new spark plugs. After cranking the engine over a few times without the coil (spark) connected in order prime the oil workings before firing off the engine. A final "priming" of the carb and checking that the throttle function operated properly it was "GO TIME"! YESSSS! ... she fired off instantly! Total time from start to finish after the "Plan of attack meeting was 2 hours (including in-between-steps discussion, coffee refills, donuts and banter. New owner of this cool "Gasser" came by moments later and was thrilled!

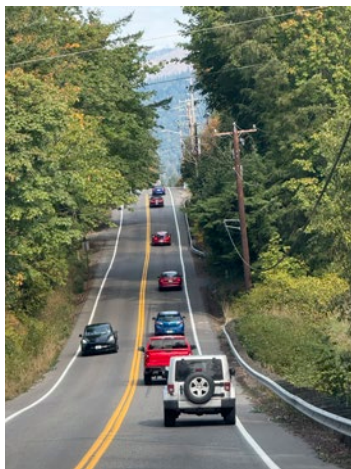

Ponies, Pigs, Pumpkin Cannons, and Peach Smoothies: Ponies in the Sun 2025 Was Amazing!

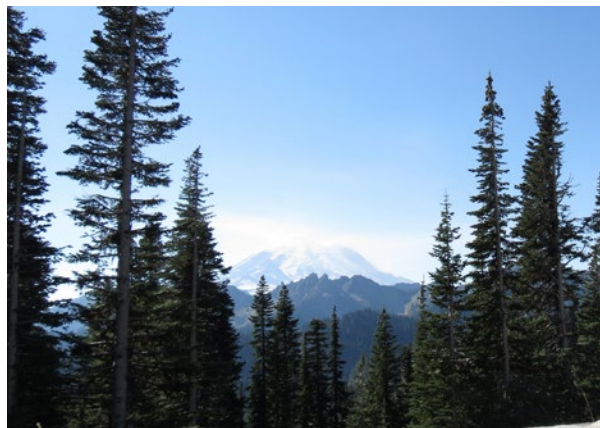
