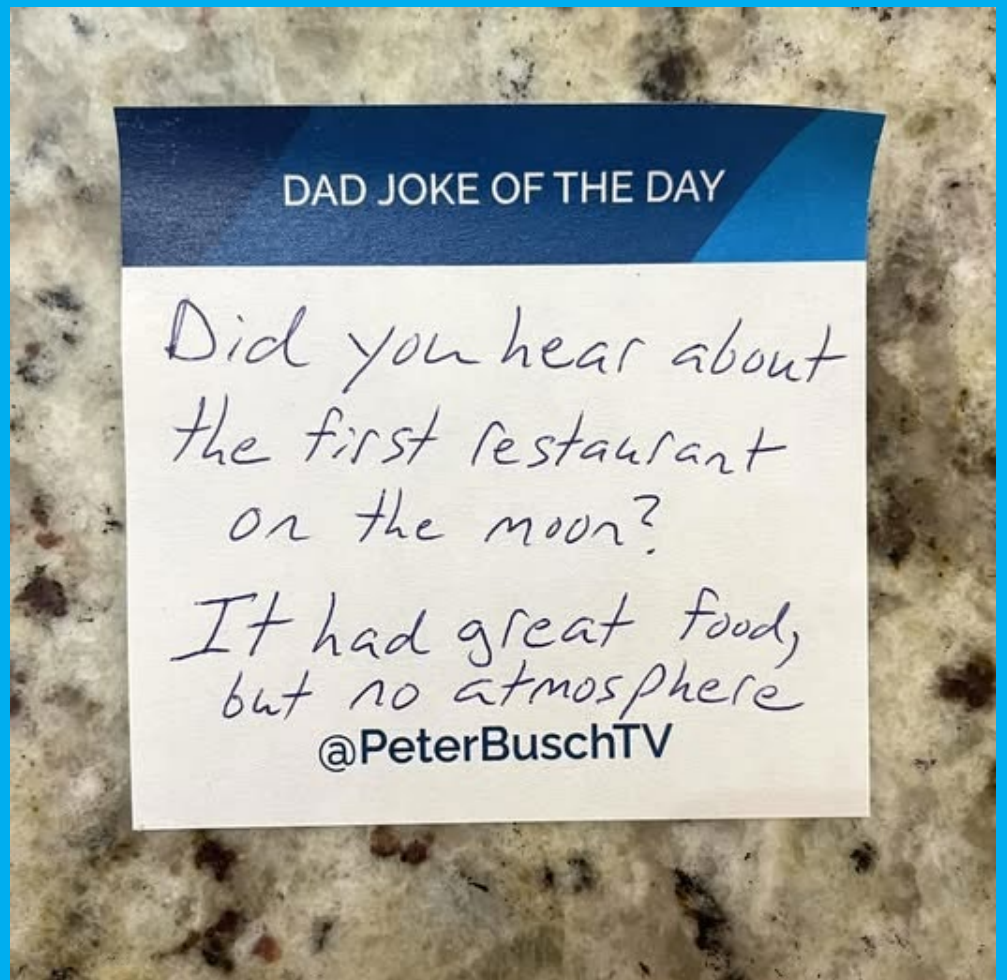

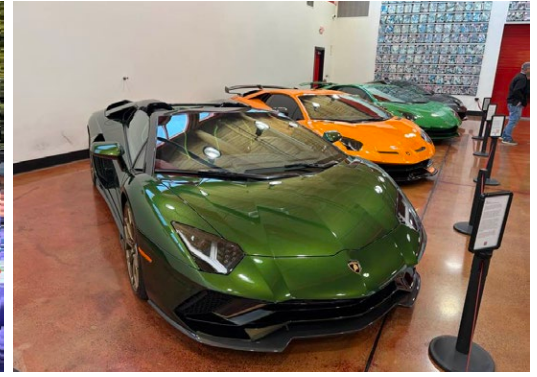
## PCMC Tech Session & Pizza Party at Griot's Garage

It was a beautiful day to learn about some spring and summer car care from the folks at Griot's Garage. We had about 30 club members in attendance, John Chudy willingly offered up his 1FSTPNY as the tester car. At the end of the day the results were amazing!

Tate from Griot's kicked off the tech session with the basics, walking us through the different paint correcting products and what they're used for. The products and corresponding pads are color-coded, which means there's no guessing which pad you need for which correcting cream. He recommended starting with the least aggressive correcting cream for buffing, then stepping up to more aggressive creams if you're not seeing the desired results. He also recommended working in approximately 2'x2' sections to prevent the cream and/or wax from drying on the car before you've had a chance to go over it. At the end of the tech session, 1FSTPNY's trunk lid looked like it was practically brand new! The scratches and cloudy areas had been buffed and polished to a high shine.

After the tech session, several club members did some retail therapy in Griot's showroom (it's like Costco, you can never go in and leave without buying something!), and perused the collection of Lamborghinis, McLarens, and Porsches before gathering in the Indy Cafe for some pizza. Thanks to Griot's for all the great tips and tricks and for hosting us for a fun and informative afternoon!

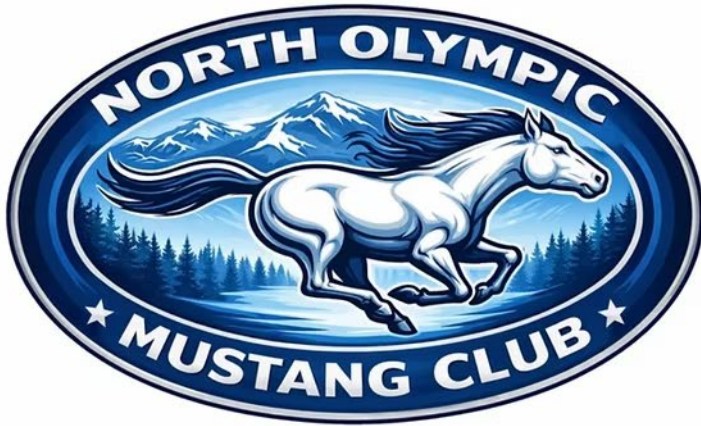

## 47th International Mustang Meet September 3rd - 7th, 2026 in Richmond BC Hosted by the Greater Vancouver Mustang Association

If you've ever considered attending the annual International Mustang Meet, IMM 47 will be right in our own backyard in Richmond BC (near Vancouver) next Labor Day Weekend Sept. 3-7, 2026). Several PCMC Members have attended IMM's in the past, to rave reviews. We have several club members who already have their cars registered and hotel booked for IMM 47. A Little History about the International Mustang Meet (thank you to Linda Hallberg) - The International Mustang Meet began in 1980 when two Mustangers, one American and one Canadian, met at a World of Wheels car show while each was showing a Mustang Convertible. They became best friends and thought it would be a great idea that an International Mustang Meet be held each year. They would start in Lethbridge, Alberta, Canada and then swap between the US and Canada each year. During that first year, there were three clubs and 75 cars, and the Labor Day weekend was chosen to allow for travel to the meet each year.

Today, the event has become more than a car show. There are 300-500 vehicles each year that gather on Labor Day weekend, and is a social event reuniting friendships made through the years. Friday night begins with a Welcome Party; Saturday is the show day followed by a BBQ in the evening. On Sunday there could be a special drive, potential Auto Cross or Poker Run, and ends with an Awards Banquet. Finally, we gather for breakfast on Monday morning and say goodbye until next year.

## 3 Strange (But Useful) Vintage Car Options

### Ford's Felling Friend

The core of a car has remained relatively the same since Karl Benz first rolled out his Patent Motorwagen in 1886: An engine that drives the wheels, steering gear, and a seat for the driver to sit upon. What has changed the most are the options. These are the luxury bits of a car, and over the years, there have been some real winners (heated seats), real cool ones (that record player in the back of DeSotos), and a few head scratchers. The one consistent has been manufacturers trying just about anything as a line item on the order sheet in the hopes of that item closing the deal inside a potential buyer's mind. Here are three options we came across recently that are both odd and oddly practical. It's up to you to decide if they were worth it back then, and maybe if they are worth trying to find today. It's fun to joke about the times in the past "when trucks were trucks," but it's hard to ignore that 50 years ago, there was the option to purchase a Ford-branded chainsaw that would mount right onto the driver's side inner fender of your F-250. The saws themselves were not Ford-built, but instead sourced from Ohlsson & Rice—which you might also recognize as Orline—before being rebranded and sold through Ford's tractor dealers. A mount for the saw that fit the inner fender under the hood of the F-250 was also available.

According to a 1971 memo from Ohlsson & Rice, there were three saws that got rebranded to Ford: The Eagle I, Eagle II, and Hawk. With 14- and 16-inch bar options between the three saws, an adventurer in their Camper Special would never be in need of wood to burn or get caught on a trail blocked by a downed tree. We'd be willing to bet the mount for the saw is rarer to find than the saw, as chainsaw collectors likely preserved the saws as novelties long before the majority of truck enthusiasts swung back around to caring about the option. No matter why these have been kept around, they're a fun piece of history that overtly highlights the changes in the definition of utility over the years.



### Chevrolet Takes Aim

Just like Ford, Chevrolet has long marketed its trucks to the outdoorsman, but while Ford was helping the buyer take down a tree, Chevy was going after the person who was putting a tree stand in that timber. That's right, for a short period, there was a time when signing paperwork for a new pickup could also come with a Winchester Model 94AE XTR .30-30 lever-action rifle.

When the weather started to turn in the fall of 1985, an interested deer hunter wouldn't need to look further than the local Chevrolet dealer to get everything—well, almost everything—needed for a successful deer season. The truck, a K10 or Blazer, got a few unique items with the Outdoorsman package: Upgraded interior trim and premium seat fabrics, outdoorsman badging, heavy-duty suspension, and of course a chunky set of tires that all got power from the four-wheel-drive system. Not attached

to the truck but included were Chevy-branded engraving on the rifle stock, rear-window rifle rack, branded gun case, Tasco 4x32 rscope, safety glasses (but no hearing protection), and Winchester promotional materials and hat.

### Stereo on the Go from Olds and Pontiac

Long before the fad of removable faceplate radios in the early 2000s, GM initiated the idea of taking the radio with you, but with functionality rather than security in mind. The 1958 Oldsmobile and Pontiac models could be optioned with the "Trans-Portable" radios. Based around the still-popular transistor radio technology but powered by four "AA" batteries, this was essentially the Bluetooth speaker of the 1950s. Some models featured a plug on the back that allowed the radio to use the car's speakers and power while inserted in the dashboard.

While feeling so ahead of its time now in the era of CarPlay, the Trans-Portable feature was short-lived. Now these radios exist as the ultimate car show accessory that will surely get more than a few comments along the lines of "wait, that's not new?"
